Understanding the Natural World	Children will be encouraged to explore the world around them through a variety of activities and themes based upon the seasons. They will learn to make observations and ask scientific questions, and become familiar with using tools and equipment to help with their enquiries.

We will learn basic weaving and sewing techniques and explore the ways that materials can be used differently. We will experience a range of music and dance opportunities whilst learning familiar songs and rhymes, and also exploring movement.					
History and	Throughout the year children will look back at their lives and share what they can remember about being					

Geography	younger and about starting school. We will invite an older member of the community to come in and share their experiences of being 4 and 5 and we will think about things that are old and new by enhancing the learning environment with different curiosities such as typewriters, cameras, records and cds and old telephones. During our walks around Witney the children will learn to identify old and new buildings and they will become familiar with simple maps. We will explore different areas of the local town such as Langal Common, St Mary's Church and the Leys, and talk about the differences in these areas. We will also talk about places in the world that we may have visited for holidays.
Helping Our Community	To encourage children to engage with the local community we will give Harvest donations to community fridge, send cards and pictures to the local care home, make donations to the food bank and provide help for refugees living in Witney.
Focus Children	Every child gets a Focus Week three times a year. During this week parents will be asked to provide a feedback form outlining the child's interests. Formal observations will be made and recorded on Seesaw and parents will receive their child's next steps in learning.
